- 1. Mayor McKenzie called the meeting to order.
- 2. Cory Stroman gave the invocation.
- 3. Mayor Pro Tem Peek led the Pledge of Allegiance to the American and the Texas Flags.
- 4. Motion was made by Mayor Pro Tem Peek, seconded by Councilman Baker to approve the minutes for meeting held on February 8, 2022. The motion carried unanimously.
- 5. Public Input: Mr. Tom Parker spoke regarding \$75.00 increase on lake lots.
 Mr. Curt Hamlin spoke regarding \$75.00 increase on lake lots.
- 6. Regular Agenda Items
 - A. Mr. Sage Diller with Enprotec/Hibbs & Todd explained to Council that 5 (five) bids were received. The lowest bid was from Fort Worth Electrical Services. Their bid was under the estimated project cost, Mr. Diller recommended that Fort Worth Electrical Services be awarded the project.

Motion was made by Councilman McPherson, seconded by Councilman Baker to approve Award of Purchase Contract for the Trailer Mounted Stand-by Generators Utilizing American Rescue Plan (ARP) Funds. The motion carried unanimously.

C. Motion was made by Councilman Baker, seconded by Mayor Pro Tem Peek to approve the Meet and Confer Agreement between the City of Sweetwater and the Sweetwater Police Patrol Association. The motion carried unanimously.
