# RESIDENTIAL REFUSE COLLECTION AND BRUSH/BULK GARBAGE PICKUP

## **GUIDELINES**

#### Dear Sweetwater Resident:

As you are aware, the City of Sweetwater has contracted residential refuse collection with Republic Services beginning October 1, 2020.

Residents have been provided with 95-gallon poly carts to place garbage and Republic Services is to pick-up the garbage in the poly carts once a week. The program also provides for a brush/bulk pick-up once a month for residents. Information had been provided to each resident the scheduled day for collection of garbage placed in 95-gallon poly carts and scheduled day for brush and bulk pick-up. A map has been provided to advise you of scheduled days for your 95-gallon poly carts garbage collection.

Information is provided below about the rules for proper 95-gallon poly cart placement and brush and bulk pick-up.

## A. Proper Refuse Cart Placement

- Refuse collection carts are scheduled for once a week pick-up. Please make sure you know what day is your scheduled pick-up day.
- Residents must have the refuse cart placed at the collection point by 6:00 a.m. on your scheduled
  collection day. The collection point is placement of the refuse cart 1 foot from the curb or edge of the
  street if collection occurs from a public street, or at the driveway location if collection occurs from an
  alley.
- Refuse carts shall not be placed at the point of collection before 6:00 p.m. the day prior to your scheduled day of collection and shall be removed within 24 hours after collection and the refuse cart stored behind the front building line and/or adjacent to the home.
- Refuse carts must be placed at least 5 feet from other objects like trees, poles, fire hydrants, mailboxes, electrical boxes, cable boxes, etc., and at least 5 feet from vehicles.
- Do not lean any objects against the refuse cart or place your refuse cart under a tree or near utility lines.
- Place the arrows on the lid of your refuse cart toward the street and the handle toward the house, with the lid closed.
- For safety reasons, please do not allow children to play in or around your cart.

## B. Brush and Bulk Items

- Brush and bulk items are scheduled for once a month pick-up. Brush/bulk items pick-up is scheduled for the 2<sup>nd</sup> Monday week of each month on your regular scheduled refuse collection pick-up day.
- Brush/bulk items should be placed curbside no more than 24 hours before scheduled brush/bulk pickup day.
